Research and development grants from the European Union for the University of Hertfordshire

The School of Health and Social Work at the University of Hertfordshire has been awarded 2 research and development grants from the European Union.

The first is 320,000 euros for the development of a programme to develop knowledge of the issues faced by women who have experienced domestic violence and mental health problems. This involves jointwork on this with partners in Italy, Poland and Slovenia.

The second is 330,000 euros granted by the EU to research into and develop an innovative e-learning MSc to be developed through interactive partnerships between experts by experience, practitioners and academics in the areas of mental health, social inclusion, leadership and recovery. The MSC in Mental Health Recovery and Social Inclusion is for professionals from all disciplines, service users, carers, service managers, policy makers and those who aspire to be leaders in their areas of expertise in their country.

The EU Erasmus Life Long Learning Programme funds this innovative and prestigious European online modular MSc.
